Nicholas Russoniello has won the prestigious Grand Final of the ABC Symphony Australia Young Performers Awards, in a stunning performance with the Queensland Symphony Orchestra conducted by Edvard Tchivzhel on Saturday 3 September at the Queensland Performing Arts Centre.

Nicholas Russoniello tackled the monumental Yoshimatsu Concerto for Saxophone and Orchestra *Cyber-bird* in a compelling performance for the 2011 ABC Symphony Australia Young Performers Awards on Saturday 3 September.

Nicholas receives a \$20,000 cash prize, multiple CD recordings of his winning performance and opportunities for future concert performances with major Australian symphony orchestras.

Originally from Wollongong, Nicholas has performed in various settings in Australia and abroad. After initial studies at the Wollongong Conservatorium of Music, Nicholas undertook the Bachelor of Music (Performance) at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music where he graduated with First Class Honours. As a student, Nicholas' distinguishing talent earned him numerous awards and scholarships which enabled him to pursue international study in the UK and France

Kate Lidbetter, CEO of Symphony Services International, says that such dedication pays off.

"This year's Grand Finalists were all extremely talented, with the three musicians all having won many prizes and scholarships previously. But with competitions there can only be one winner and Nicholas Russoniello's performance was truly outstanding," she says.

"Many of the previous Awards winners are now household names in the classical music world, both in Australia and overseas. The Awards give musicians a career launching pad as well as the opportunity of playing with a major symphony orchestra."

Nicholas is a celebrated performer and regularly plays with the ensemble Duo Histoire in concerts around Australia. His merits also include performing as a soloist with the Orchestra Dell'Accademia Musicale di Schio, Vicenza and the Synchron Quartet, for the Società Dei Concerti Milan. In 2011 Nicholas became a member of the saxophone quartet Continuum Sax.

The Grand Final will be also telecast on ABC TV1 at 4pm on Sunday 16 October.
